TECHNOLOGY GROWS WITH GRANT WRITING, "RAISE THE PADDLE"

At All Saints, we understand the importance of preparing students to live and thrive in the world infused with technology. All classrooms are equipped with interactive white boards, students attend weekly computer classes, an additional mobile lab is available for online research and classroom activities, and we continue to increase technology throughout the building each academic year.


All Saints received the Archdiocesan School Outreach Grant, and along with a generous donation from the Ken Birecki Technology Fund, we were able to purchase iPad technology for our junior high classrooms. A mobile cart with 30 iPads for student use is active in our 7th and 8th grade classrooms providing technology-based instruction and learning.

This past November, during our 16th Annual "Growing Our Future" Auction & Gala, we introduced "Raise the Paddle" as a new tradition, asking families to support technology expansion. All Saints raised almost \$15,000 for iPad technology, allowing us to purchase a number of Apple TVs, teacher iPads, and iPad stations for center-based learning in grades K, 1, and 2 and a mobile cart for math and science in grades 4-6.



COMMUNITY GIVES BACK TO FOOD PANTRY

During our Advent Giving Tree project, our All Saints community had the opportunity to brighten the Christmas holiday for needy children by partnering with the All Saints Food Pantry in southwest Detroit. Each grade "adopted" families, and the generosity our community was absolutely incredible. More than 900 gifts poured in, including bicycles, scooters, winter coats, board games, dolls, books, and much more. Watching All Saints students wrap gifts in the hallways and classrooms was wonderful to see, and the All Saints Food Pantry had to make three trips to our school to transport gifts.



New Year, New Opportunities

With more than 20 student activities to choose from, All Saints added a variety of new programs and extracurricular activities for our students to participate in this year.

Our Blue Thunder athletics program successfully established two new sports: cross country in the fall and bowling in the winter, both sports experienced very successful seasons. Our basketball season saw record numbers, fielding 12 teams starting at fourth grade, and we continued to excel on the hardwood, sending four teams to playoff division games and many more to post-season tournaments.

We also introduced three new extra-curricular clubs for students this year. The Healthy Kids Club for students in grades 3-5 focuses on staying active and making healthy choices. Over 15 students are participating in the club and spread the message of health and nutrition to the entire student body through daily announcements.

We were also able to offer Beginning Band for those students interested in playing an instrument as an ensemble. 19 students in grades 5-8 have been practicing the flute, clarinet, trumpet, and trombone and gave their first performance during our Christmas concert.

The Thunder Store had its grand opening on January 11, 2016. This after school club, opened to students in grades 5-8, focuses on developing small business skills such as inventory, budgets, accounting, and marketing. The Thunder Store is open during lunch periods so all students (K-8) can make purchases.

STUDENTS PREPARE FOR ANNUAL RETREATS

All Saints encourages an environment that fosters love, compassion, and inquiry of spirit and faith. One of the faith-based experiences provided for students is a grade level retreat.

Kindergarten

Theme: New Beginnings
Experience: Our kindergarten
students were led through a "new
beginnings" prayer service in
our school chapel and decorated
bookmarks and brown paper lunch
bags for the less fortunate. Students
also met new students from the other
classrooms and learned different
things about each other.

First Grade

Theme: Friendship

Experience: One very special gift God has given us is the gift of friends. During this retreat, our first grade students read from scripture, sang songs, and shared a snack with their classmates. Each child created a friendship bracelet kit for Children's Hospital of Michigan, as well as decorated a prayer card, to extend friendship to other children struggling with illness.

Second Grade

Theme: First Communion
Experience: As our second grade
students prepare to make their First
Holy Communion, they will rotate
through five different stations to gain
a better understanding of the various
parts of Mass. Students will also spend
time working in the Resurrection
Parish garden, creating banners and
bread tags, and practicing to receive
communion with unleavened bread.

Third Grade

Theme: Being Children of Light Experience: Students will focus on becoming the Light of Jesus during their retreat. They will participate in a prayer service and reflection and share their light by donating new light bulbs and light fixtures to Habitat for Humanity.







Fourth Grade

Theme: God's Mercy

Experience: Fourth graders will travel to an off-campus retreat center to learn to pray and walk with a labyrinth. Bible readings, songs, and reflections will occur throughout the day and students will create a labyrinth craft and participate in a service activity.

Fifth Grade

Theme: Father Solanus Casey **Experience:** Students in 5th grade will visit the Father Solanus Casey Center in Detroit for a tour, prayer reflection, and Mass. During the day students will volunteer their time serving the center. Upon returning to school, students will teach our first grade students about Father Casey.

Sixth Grade

Theme: The Jubilee Year of Mercy **Experience:** Our 6th grade students will visit the Cathedral of the Most Blessed Sacrament and will participate in Mass and confession. Students will create care packages for homeless shelters in downtown Detroit.

Seventh, Eighth Grade

Theme: Tested

Experience: The junior high students' retreat focused on recognizing the gift of faith in their lives and how to use that faith to strengthen and prepare themselves for the trials that lay ahead.
