

PAVING THE WAY FOR MORE ENRICHMENT

Thanks to the generosity of so many families and friends of All Saints, last school year's fundraising efforts resulted in a record number of donations and paved the way for a number of important improvements throughout the school, including the completion of our roof project and a number of other facility enhancements.

One exciting area the *Fund for All Saints* was able to support was the construction of our new 4th through 8th grade student enrichment room. Providing students with additional support is a top priority, and this year we were able to hire an additional full-time enrichment teacher, bringing the number of support positions to three.

The *Fund for All Saints* allowed us to convert part of our library workroom into a student-centered area where students can receive 1:1 or small group support. The area also provides students with workstations, iPads, and Smartboard technology.


