All Saints is not just a Catholic school in name; our faith is the root of all we do. Every decision we make - from the curriculum we use to the activities we provide students and the community - is done with a faith-first mindset.

We believe our students are exceptionally well prepared for high school and beyond, and the data agrees. The National Assessment of Educational Progress, a congressionally mandated report card on academic progress in the country, found that Catholic schools in the United States outperform public and charter schools.

Students struggled during the pandemic. Math and reading scores dropped significantly, setting many students back substantially.

However, Catholic schools across the nation either held steady or showed only minor learning loss. In fact, eighth grade students in Catholic schools managed to improve math scores by one point, while both charter and public eighth grade students lost three points. Overall, Catholic schools students' scores average 15 points higher than those of their public and charter school peers.

We know we are blessed to have the opportunity to provide our students a Catholic education at All Saints. We ask that you keep us in your prayers as we continue to

COREKNOWLEDGE

At All Saints, we are committed to academic excellence. Our team of staff and administrators work tirelessly to research and implement the best curriculum and educational practices, utilizing cutting-edge technology.

Our curriculum is based on the Core Knowledge Sequence, which encompasses language arts, mathematics, science, history, geography, fine arts, and physical education. This curriculum exceeds the statemandated curriculum, providing a cumulative, coherent, and content-specific foundation.

The Core Knowledge Sequence is characterized by knowledge that is:

- Solid lasting, unchanging knowledge such as important events in world history;
- Sequenced a planned progression building on previous knowledge and eliminating excessive repetition and gaps;
- Specific clearly defined knowledge at each grade level, ensuring fairness for all students; and
- Shared providing all students, regardless of background, with the shared knowledge they need to be included in our national literate culture.
