# 2021-22 HIGHLIGHTS

## ACADEMIC EXCELLENCE

- Spring 2022 Star Testing for Grades 1-8 saw 64% of students in reading and 76% in math above the 60th percentile, meeting Archdiocese of Detroit benchmarks. Additionally, 43% of students in reading and 57% in math were above the 75 percentile, exceeding the AOD benchmarks.
- Fifty-five seventh and eighth grade students were inducted into the ASCS chapter of the National Junior Honor Society (NJHS) at a ceremonial Mass in February.
- Our dedicated staff continued to make learning fun and interactive with annual projects including: first grade Animal Habitat Day, second grade Immigration Day and Money Carnival, third grade Native American Living Posters and Roman Day, fourth Grade Bottle Biographies, fifth grade Renaissance Day, sixth Grade Metric Olympics and Greek Day, and seventh Grade Roaring '20s Day.
- New academic offerings this year included a dissection class for eighth graders learning anatomy.



## SERVICE TO OTHERS

- Several charitable drives were completed to provide necessities for the homeless including our annual Lenten Hygiene Drive, our seventh and eighth graders filling "Blessings Bags," and seventh graders creating "plarn" out of plastic shopping bags to be woven into waterproof mats.
- The Christmas spirit was alive with more than \$12,500 worth of donations to Child Welfare Programs out of Catholic Charities of SE Michigan. Prayer Buddies also teamed up to create Christmas cards for those in assisted living facilities.
- Our sixth graders raised \$2,054 for clean water and improved sanitation in South Sudan through their Walk for Water project.
- The school collected over various goods and more than \$3,000 to help support those aiding victims of the war in Ukraine.
- We showed support and love to women and children in our community by collecting baby items during Catholic Schools Week for charities that support pregnant women in need.
- Our eighth graders filled Jared Boxes of fun items for local Children's hospitals as part of their lessons on Works of Mercy.



# SHARING OUR FAITH

- Our Virtues in Practice program continued allowing Grades K-8 students ways to connect with Jesus' life, including eighth grade service projects related to the monthly virtue.
- The Prayer Buddies program continued, allowing students from kindergarten through third grade to connect to students from grades four through eight in prayer, service, and community.
- A virtual Nativity Night was presented online, giving students and their families an opportunity to reflect on the journey of Christ's birth during the Advent season.
- Our community welcomed the return of all-school, in-person mass in the early spring for the first time since March 2020. We also welcomed back our Friday Parents in Prayer group.
- In-person retreat experiences for our students returned. First grade focused on "Friendship with Jesus;" third grade focused on kindness; and fourth grade reflected on the Parable of the Good Samaritan. Our fifth and sixth grade students traveled downtown to the Solanus Casey Center for their retreat, where they had a tour, private Mass, and a scavenger hunt.
- As part of the Lenten journey, seventh grade students performed Living Stations of the Cross for students and families. Seventh and eighth grade students had the opportunity to receive the Sacrament of Reconciliation during Lent.
- We hosted our second graders and their parents for a special Mass in celebration of the students' First Communion.



## COMMUNITY BUILDING

- Field trips resumed, allowing students to take their learning outside of our school walls. Outings included visits to Plymouth Orchard, the Matthaei Botanical Gardens, the U of M Natural History Museum, the Detroit Institute of Arts, and the Basilica de Ste. Anne. Our seventh and eighth grade classes toured the Cathedral of the Most Blessed Sacrament in Detroit as part of their retreat experiences. Seventh graders also had the special opportunity to visit the Holocaust Memorial Center in Farmington Hills where they heard the story of Holocaust survivor Benjamin Kawer from his daughter.
- Our eighth graders spent a day at various venues, including a visit to Saint Aloysius in Detroit for a service project, tour, and Mass, followed by fun at Full Throttle Adrenaline Park, an escape room, and a fancy dinner in downtown Detroit.
- Blue Thunder JV and Varsity Cross Country teams won CYO Division championships.
- Blue Thunder First Lego League Robotics attended the Explore Festival at Canton High School and received the Gigawatt award for their Lego engineering project.
- The Fun Fair returned with giant inflatables, carnival snacks, and games.
- Our 22nd annual Growing our Future Auction was held online on April 9, 2022 with plans to resume the live event in 2023. The auction raised \$85,225. We are grateful to all who donated and participated!
- More than 100 golfers attended the All Saints Golf Classic on August 21, 2021 at the Inn at St. John's, which raised \$13,705!



## IMPROVING OUR FACILITIES

- Two new playground structures were installed for our early childhood and kindergarten programs. Our back playground also received new benches.
- New copiers were provided for staff, and two classrooms received new air conditioning units.
- Improvements, repairs, and maintenance were performed on the building gutters, roof, gym bleachers, gym system, the multipurpose room divider, and the art room kiln.
- Security updates included the rekeying of exterior and interior doors, the purchase of additional portable radios, and the upgrade of our building lockdown system with direct connection to the Canton Police.


# CONDENSED FINANCIAL SUMMARY

## FISCAL YEAR ENDING JUNE 30, 2022


